



San Juan County Community Survey: Monument Valley

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EXTENSION




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This report presents the results of the San Juan Community Survey and more specifically for the Monument Valley community area (n = 58). The survey assessed resident needs and perceptions about key community concerns.

The online survey had an overall sample of 558 county residents. The below results highlight key findings for the Monument Valley community area which includes substance abuse, mental health, childhood literacy, and abuse and violence.




Topics organizations and agencies should focus on:

Monument Valley residents ranked the topical areas in which the most effort should be made by local organizations and agencies. The top three topical areas were:

-  1. Preventing Drug and/or Alcohol Abuse
-  2. Mental Health and Suicide Prevention
-  3. Building Strong and Healthy Families




Most important services to residents:

Monument Valley residents ranked the services most important to them. The top three included:

- 1  Running Water
- 2  Local Jobs
- 3  Healthcare

Lowest satisfaction of availability of services:

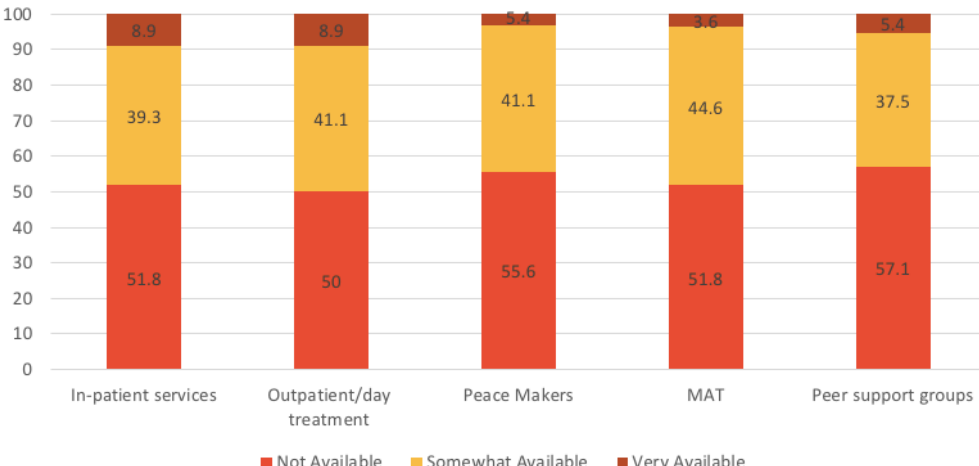
Monument Valley residents ranked their satisfaction with available services. Residents were least satisfied with the availability of:

- 1  Road Maintenance
- 2  Local Jobs
- 3  Healthy Food Options

Data on Drugs and Alcohol Abuse Services & Concern for Community Misuse:

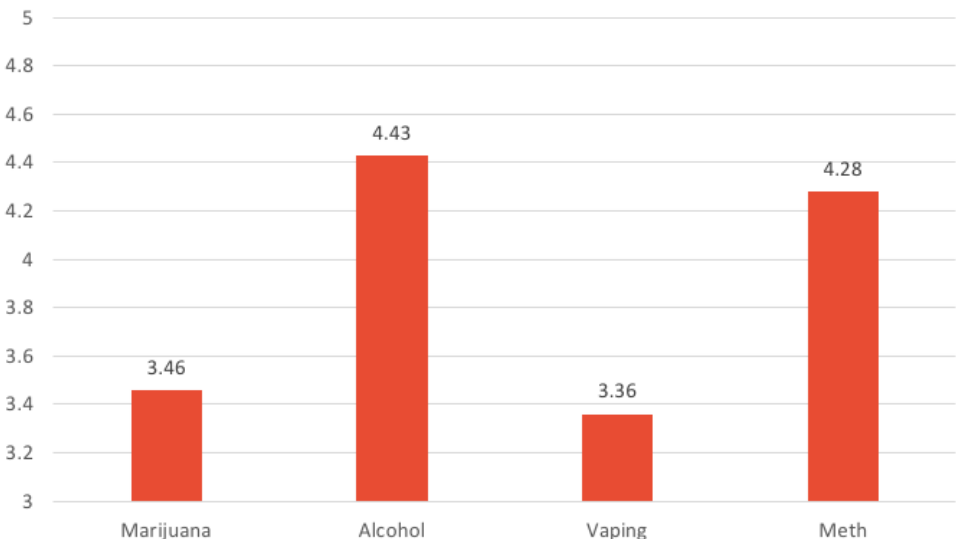
Respondents think that services are mostly not available.

Respondents reported a high level of concern of alcohol and meth in the community.

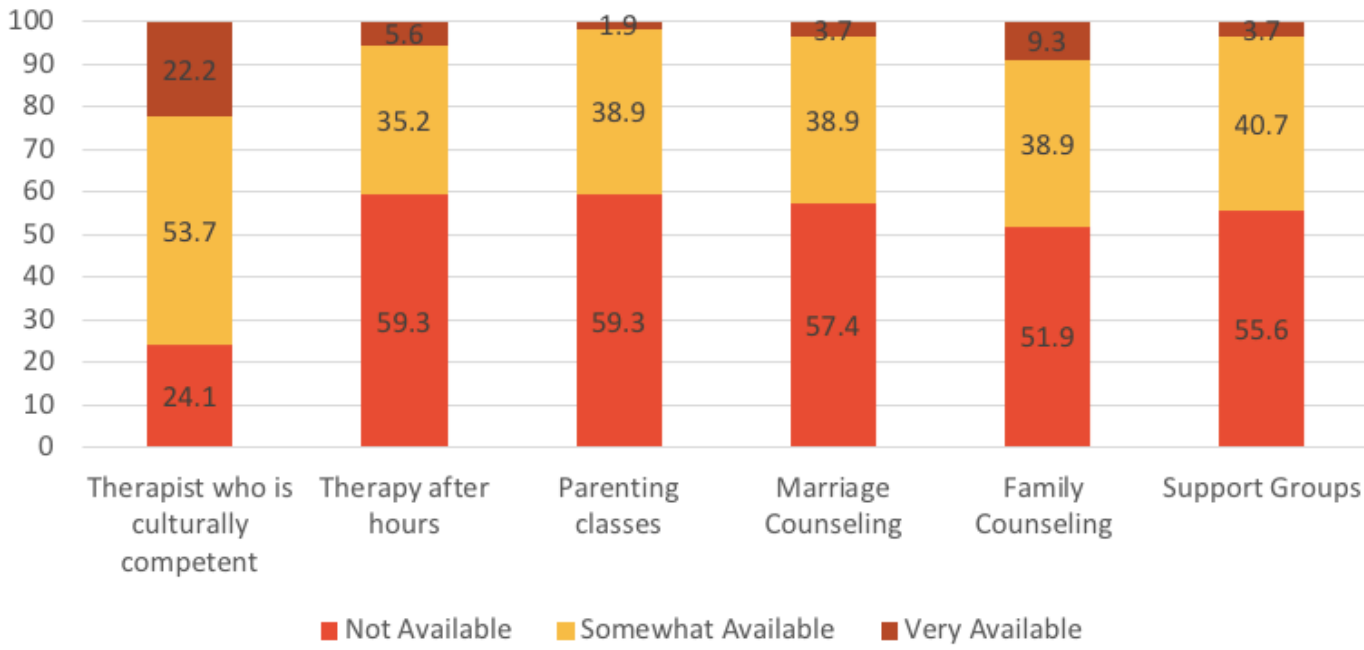
Level of concern about substance misuse (%)



Data on Mental Health and Suicide Ideation:

Monument Valley residents identified that most mental health services were mostly not available with the exception of culturally competent therapists.

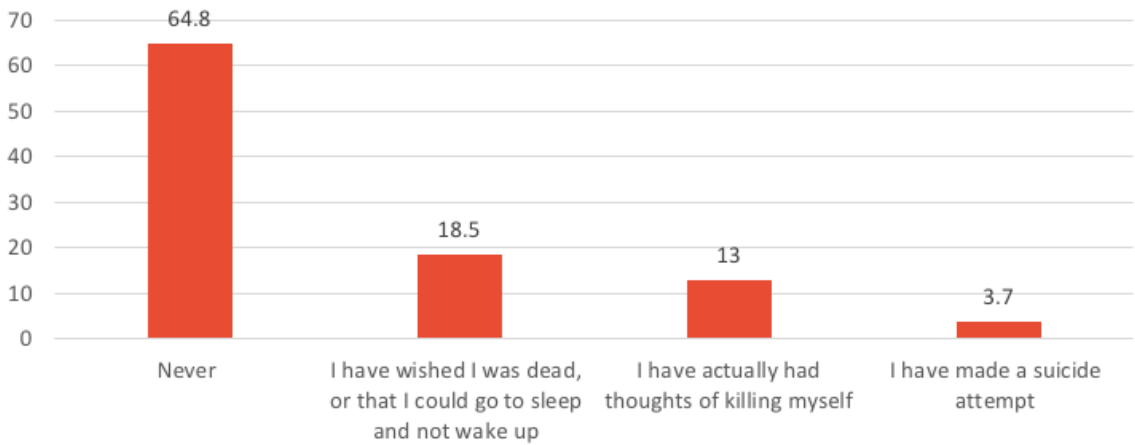
Availability of mental health services (%)



A little less than half (41.8%) of Monument Valley community residents who completed the survey reported that at some point they have had a mental health concern.

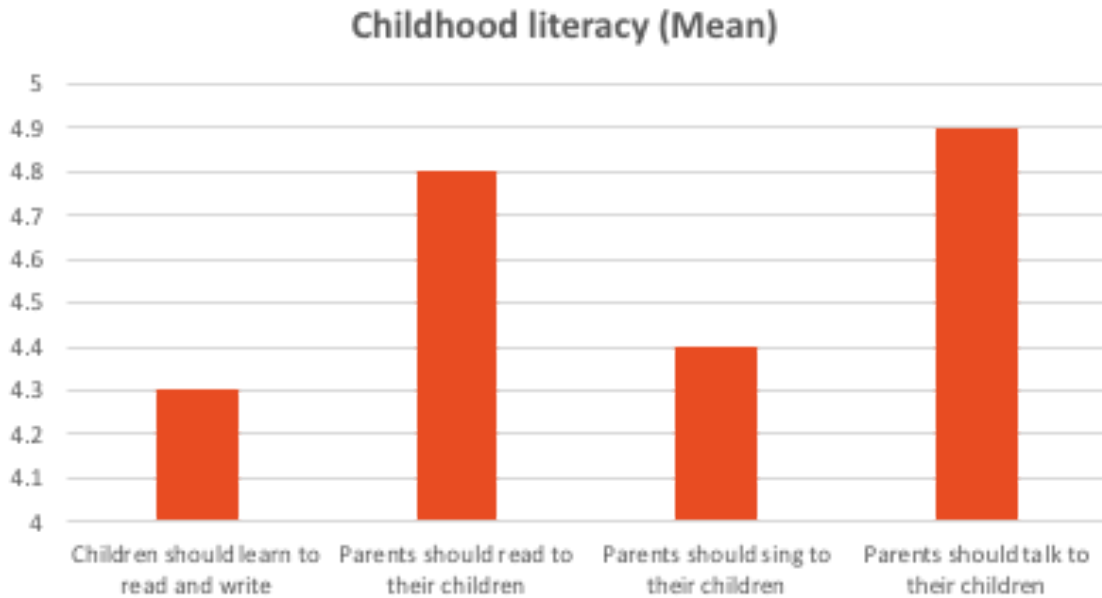
Of Monument Valley community residents who completed the survey, 35.2% reported suicide ideation or attempt in their life.

Have you ever thought about or attempted to kill yourself? (%)

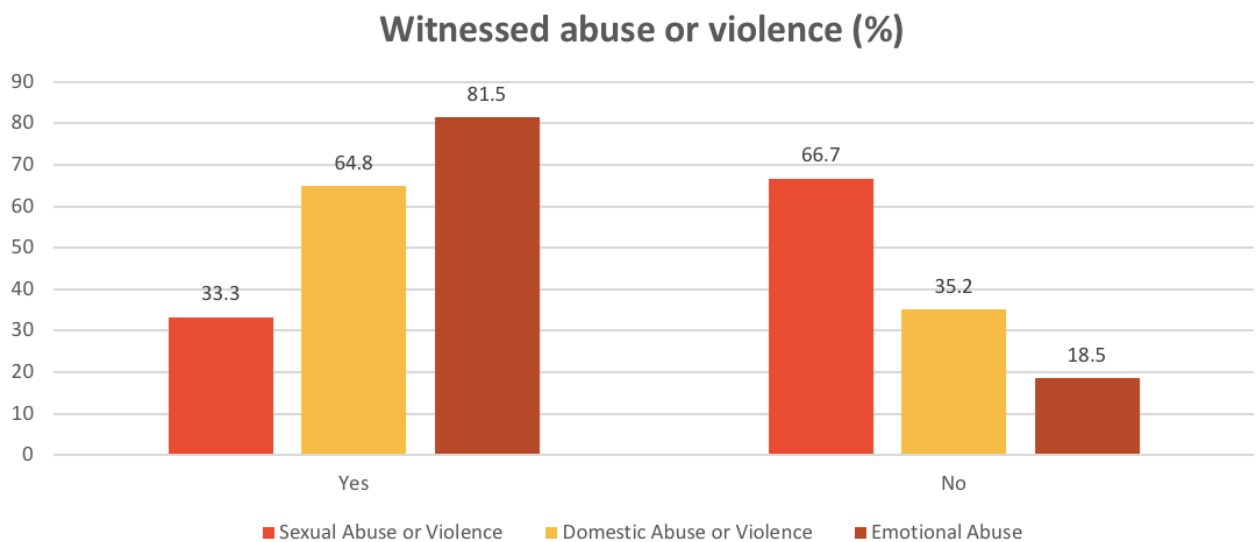


Data on Building Healthy and Strong Families:

Of Monument Valley residents who completed the survey, respondents highly agree that child literacy is important.
